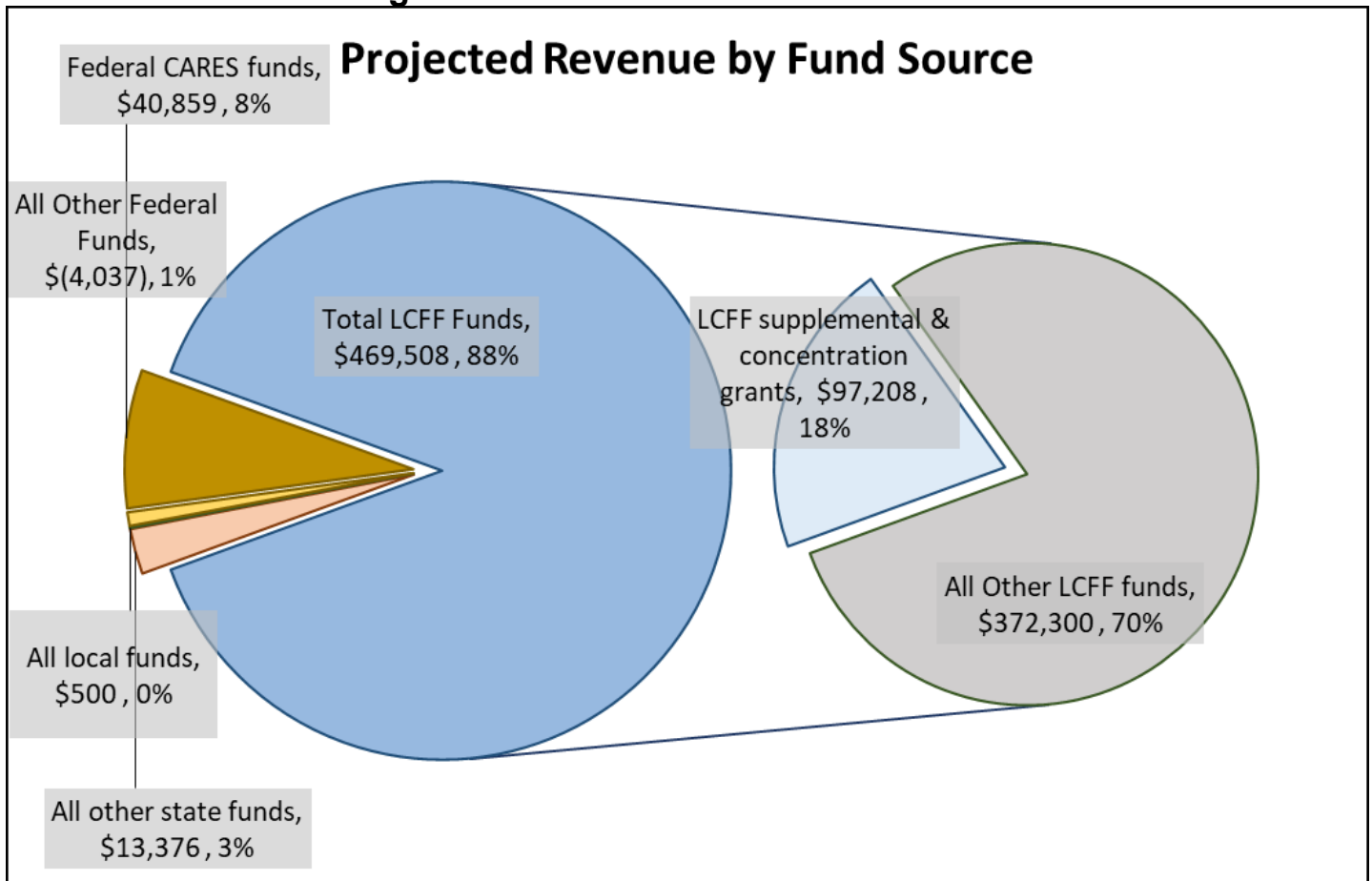

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).

## Budget Overview for the 2020-21 LCAP Year

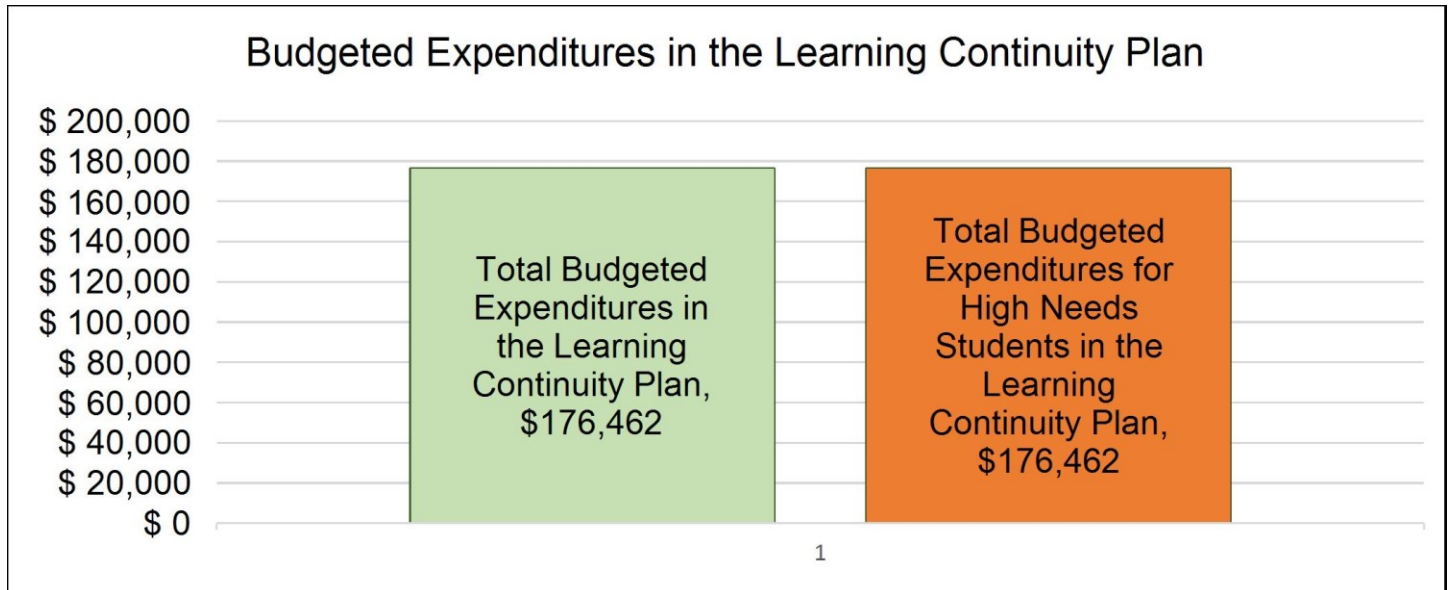


This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Independence Charter School expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Independence Charter School is \$520,206, of which \$469,508 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$13,376 is other state funds, \$500 is local funds, and \$36,822 is federal funds. Of the \$36,822 in federal funds, \$40,859 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$469,508 in LCFF Funds, \$97,208 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

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For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Plan replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to describe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Independence Charter School plans to spend for planned actions and services in the Learning Continuity Plan for 2020-2021 and how much of the total is tied to increasing or improving services for high needs students.

Independence Charter School plans to spend \$534,219 for the 2020-21 school year. Of that amount, \$176,462 is tied to actions/services in the Learning Continuity Plan and \$357,757 is not included in the Learning Continuity Plan. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the Learning Continuity Plan will be used for the following:

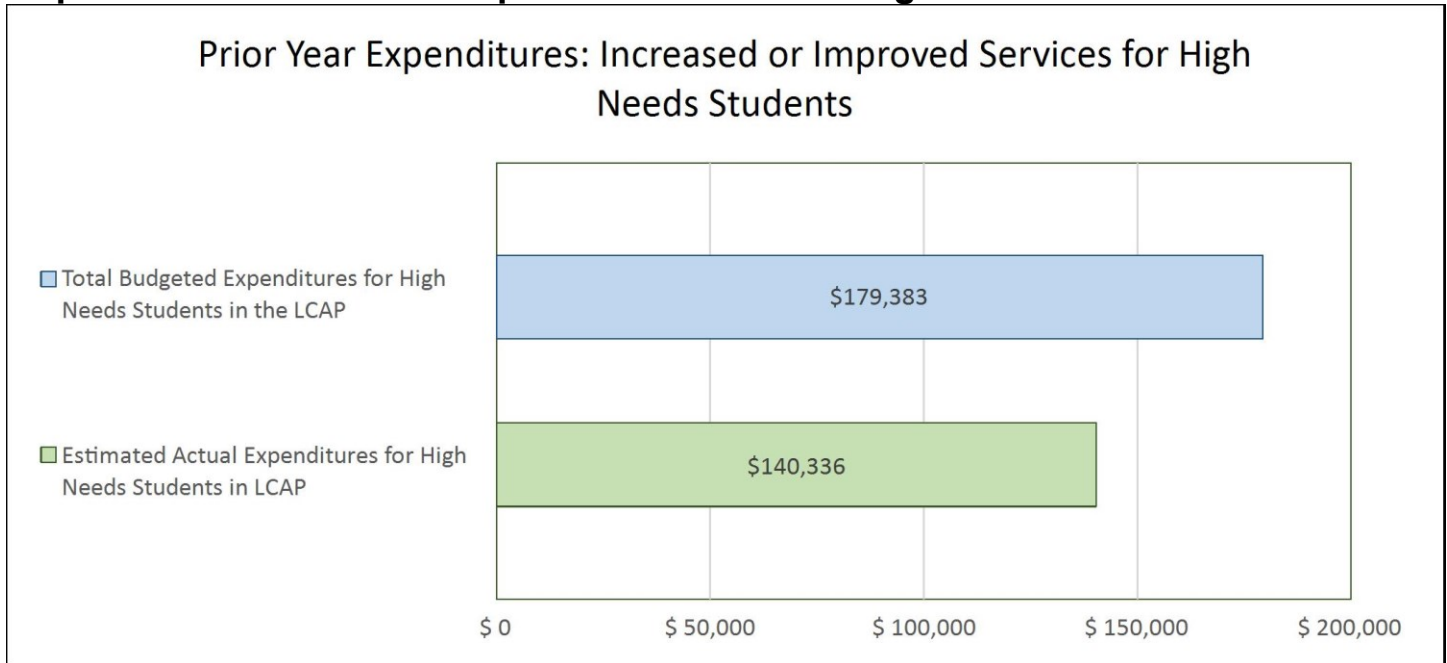
Other General Fund expenditures that are not included in the LCAP are used for salaries and benefits; books and supplies; services; operating expenditures; capital outlay; and other outgoing.

## Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in in the Learning Continuity Plan for the 2020-2021 School Year

In 2020-21, Independence Charter School is projecting it will receive \$97,208 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Independence Charter School must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the Learning Continuity Plan. Independence Charter School plans to spend \$176,462 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the Learning Continuity Plan.

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## Update on Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in 2019-20



This chart compares what Independence Charter School budgeted in the 2019-20 LCAP for actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students with what Independence Charter School actually spent on actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students in the 2019-20 school year.

In 2019-20, Independence Charter School's LCAP budgeted \$179,383 for planned actions to increase or improve services for high needs students. Independence Charter School actually spent \$140,336 for actions to increase or improve services for high needs students in 2019-20.

Our actions and services were not impacted by the overall decrease in expenditures compared to the dollars budgeted.
