## II. DISCUSSION/INFORMATION AGENDA

- A. Report and Finding on the Collection and Expenditure of Development Fees for Fiscal Years 2018-2019 and 2019-2020
  - Superintendent explained this report provides the Board and Public specific information pertaining to the accounting and expenditures of the development fees collected in our District. A description of the fees and the amounts were discussed. The fees collected will be used to pay down outstanding debt services.
- B. California Dashboard and CAASPP Data Reflecting 2018-2019 School Year Results
  - 1) Superintendent reviewed student scores based on the Spring 2018-2019 CAASPP results.

Gary Dew asked how the Parent Institute of Quality Education (PIQE) is working and did the district see an increase in student test scores based on the parent participation. Superintendent responded that the program has been very successful with the second class having 56 parents in attendance. The next cohort of PIOE

will move to Salida Middle School. Because absenteeism is a concern among our English Learners, we are hopeful that participating parents will understand the importance of being in school every day.

- C. School Board Self-Evaluation and Governance Handbook January, 2019
  - 1) In accordance with our Governance, the Board reviewed the Governance Handbook. With no changes, the handbook will be brought back to the January, 2020 meeting for Action. The Board will complete their self evaluations and review them in open session next month.

## D. Superintendent's Report

- 1) Superintendent reported the United States Census 2020 begins April 1, 2020. California schools are encouraged to include parents, teachers, and administrators in the outreach to get everyone counted. The Board may decide to pass a resolution to relay the importance of the census information and the financial impact census counts have on districts and communities.
- E. Report of Meetings Attended by Board of Education Members
  - 1) Virginia Berry reported that she attended the California School Boards Association conference. It was a very good conference with a lot of important information. She enjoyed the Farm to Fork presentation and what is being done around the state with student meals. At the conference, she shared with the session leaders that Salida Union School District owns an almond farm that produces its own almonds. The presenters were very impressed the information.
  - 2) Gary Dew reported on his experience at the conference. He stated that he specifically appreciated the Special Education sessions. He was surprised by the amount of sessions that were led by attorneys. It speaks to the amount of lawsuits that are filed in this state and the direction California education laws are going.
  - 3) Nanci Fox reported on her conference experience. After attending sessions involving Board Relationships, she appreciated the relationship our Board has with each other and with the Superintendent. It is important that our Board is able to discuss important topics openly and respectfully.
  - 4) Linda Brughelli reported that she gained a great deal of knowledge at the conference. She enjoyed the sessions on Funding, Finance and Priorities, the importance of schools being safe havens for the community in a catastrophic situation, better identifying the power of democracy and civic union, and encouraging school districts to reinvigorate lessons of civics, government, and law.


