II. DISCUSSION/INFORMATION AGENDA

- A. Quarterly Report on Williams Complaints, Subject Area of Complaints, and Resolution of Complaints.
 - 1. There were no complaints reported at this time.
- B. Reading of Mandated Updates to Board Bylaws, Board Policies, Administrative Regulations, and Exhibits.
 - Policies and Mandates were read and recommendations were given for consideration. On BP/AR 5141.21, the Board chose Option 2 prohibiting the administration of medicinal cannabis to students on school grounds by parents. It was also decided to remove "Emergency Medication for Opioid Overdose" which would have allowed for the School Nurse to administer emergency drugs to reverse the effect of opioid overdose. BP/AR Courses of Study will be pulled and current policy will remain in effect. With the aforementioned changes, the policies will be brought back to the May Meeting for consent. BP 4113.5 Working Remotely and BP 6157 Distance Learning require time to review with the bargaining units and options will be brought to the Board for consideration at a later date.
- C. Student Grading During COVID-19
 - As a result of school closures, the State has mandated students will not be issued a lesser grade than they
 acquired prior to the school closure. While grades cannot change, it is important students are encouraged to
 complete the work issued to them. Superintendent presented the Board with options to consider for grading
 during Distance Learning. After discussion, the Board chose to have teachers issue "credit" or "no credit"
 for work assigned at the middle school. The gradebook will remain open in Aeries for parents to monitor
 their child's progress in completing the assigned work. No new Trimester 3 grades will be issued.
- D. Superintendent's Report
 - 1. Superintendent reported that during the Stanislaus County Superintendents meeting, SCOE's CBO encouraged districts to begin scrutinizing their budgets looking through the same lens we use to close out a school year for unaudited actuals.

- 2. Dale Scott will be in attendance at the May 19th Board Meeting to update the Board on the results of the March election and also discuss options of placing an initiative on the November 2020 ballot.
- E. Report of Meetings Attended by Board of Education Members.
 - Gary Dew reported that he was very impressed with the food distribution at Salida Elementary. He felt the
 cafeteria staff is well organized and doing a great job of getting the meals out to the families. He also shared
 that he assisted in putting together the Kindergarten Learning Packets and appreciated knowing what is being
 distributed to our students. He witnessed the Chromebook rollout and felt it was an excellent coordinated
 effort. He stated that during this very challenging time, he greatly appreciates the job our Kitchen, Custodial,
 Site and Teaching staff has done to ensure our students are getting what they need.
 - 2. Virginia Berry reported she witnessed the distribution of Chromebooks, library books, Learning Packets, and food at Sisk Elementary. She appreciates the staff and feels they have been doing an excellent job. She also noticed an increase in the amount of students coming during food distribution.
 - 3. Dennis Thompson reported he also has been visiting the sites and is very impressed by the work that is being done.
