II. DISCUSSION/INFORMATION AGENDA

- A. Quarterly Report on Williams Complaints, Subject Area of Complaints, and Resolution of Complaints
 - 1. There have been no complaints at this time.
- B. School Waiver Application Process for School Re-Opening
 - 1. The Salida Union School District Waiver was submitted to the County and approved on October 16, 2020. This Waiver allows for Kindergarten through 5th grade students to return to campus for in-person learning in phases. School Administrators contacted parents for their choice of distance or in-person learning and this information was used to create class rosters for grade levels returning and those choosing to stay on distance learning.
 - Currently, our plan is to bring 1st and 2nd grade students back on October 26th. 3rd Grade would return on November 9th, followed by 4th Grade on November 30th. Kindergarten and 5th Grade would return after Winter Break. As long as the County remains in the red, our goal is to bring 4th Grade back as early as November 9th and Kindergarten and 5th Grade on November 30th. Superintendent asked the Board Members if they had interest in reopening Salida Middle School before Winter Break. After much discussion, the Board chose to bring back all grade levels prior to Winter Break. All Board Members were very complimentary of the teachers and staff and appreciate all of the hard work and dedication the staff has put in to educating our students during this time.

C. Superintendent's Report

- 1. Superintendent asked the Board for direction on having board meetings remain closed to the public or return to in-person board meetings. It was decided to remain closed to the public for safety reasons until further notice.
- D. Report of Meetings Attended by Board of Education Members
 - 1. Gary Dew reported how much he appreciates the Nutrition Department and the work they do in meeting the food needs of the students and community. He is very impressed with how well organized the department is and complimented staff on doing such a great job. He also complimented the Staff for how they are distributing curriculum to parents/students in a safe and effective manner. He stated that he has noticed that teachers have been early to work and leaving late. He appreciates the awesome job everyone has been doing.
- E. Items to be Placed on Future Board of Education Agenda.
 - 1. Linda Brughelli stated that in a post pandemic world of education, she would like a discussion about getting back to our roots, the purpose of elementary education, and what best gets us back to these goals. For many children,

school is a safe place and it is important that we be mindful of decisions we make along the way and that they are in concert with the purpose and goal.

Nanci E. Fox agreed stating we should also look at the Charter School as an online distance learning option. This would give families a choice in the future when all students do return for in-person learning.

Gary Dew stated that while it is important to be in the classroom, there are parents who will want that a distance learning model and we need to be prepared to provide it to them.

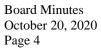
